RECOGNITION

The City was recently awarded the **James Baird Leadership Award for 2017** from the Illinois Public Employer Labor Relations Association (IPELRA).
This annual award recognizes leadership and achievement in Illinois public sector labor relations.
The IPELRA Board determined that the City's labor relations efforts for negotiating unique language to address the possible reduction of the Local Government Distributive Funds (LGDF) are positive contributions to the Illinois public sector labor relations field.

In accepting the award on behalf of the City, DeSha Kalmar stressed the importance of the communications and relationships that have been built with the employees over the years. It began years ago with the City Manager and her holding regular meetings with all of City employees, sharing information about what's going on in the City.
