
service to our residents, but also in being leaders in our respective fields.



What is an EAP and does the City have one?

Our **Employee Assistance Program (EAP)** consists of City-provided benefits that help employees cope with personal problems that may impact job performance, health, and personal well-being and has expanded to include treatment for a variety of issues that affect job performance. Our EAP provides confidential support for employees experiencing difficulty with their personal and professional lives.

The Family Service EAP assists with a variety of problems including:

- Presenteeism
- Absenteeism
- Alcoholism
- Mental health
- Financial problems
- Smoking cessation
- Marital difficulties
- Work/life balance
- Substance abuse
- Stress management
- Poor job performance
- Fatigue/sleep problems

If you experience any of these, consider looking into the City's EAP through Family Service. **Cost for counseling:** The City pays 100% for the first 12 sessions; 75% for the next 12 sessions, and 50% after 24 sessions. The employee is responsible for the portion not covered by the City on a sliding-scale fee, based on the individual's ability to pay.
