CLAIM REFUND SCAM

Professional Benefit Administrators (**PBA**) has recently learned that text messages are being sent to random individuals asking recipients to go to <u>claimforpba.com</u> and fill in personal information, including sensitive banking information.

This fraudulent website and text messages have nothing to do with PBA, and they have identified this threat as a known "phishing" scam and reported this to all major internet authorities.

As far as PBA knows, none of their employer groups have been targeted by this scam. Your personal information is safe and there is no direct threat to the City or our employees.

In the event you receive an email or text of this nature, immediately delete it. Anyone who navigates to this fraudulent website and enters personal information runs the risk of exposing information to malicious entities. PBA will never request information of this type and will never contact a member by email or text to request any sensitive information.

EMPLOYEE TIPS

The importance of keeping beneficiaries up to date. A story from Sev Meneshian:

Early on in my career, I happened to take a call from a customer whose husband had just passed away. The widow was calling in because she thought that she was the beneficiary of her husband's 457 deferred compensation plan.

Sadly, her husband forgot to update his beneficiary designation on the account, and a very large sum of money went to his ex-wife. As hard as she tried to get access to the money, the last I heard, the court could not help her. The judge simply could not make assumptions and the woman wound up with nothing.

Now that your taxes are done, please take some time to make sure your beneficiary designations are up to date. Accounts such as checking, savings, retirement, life insurance, etc. should be carefully reviewed from time to time. Although some jurisdictions are forgiving when it comes to unintended beneficiaries, don't leave things to the courts.
