# Tough Economy Boosts Library Circulation But Decimates System Funding

In the proverbial good news – bad news category, the Library enjoyed record circulation for FY10: 488,056 items checked out, up 20%, patron visits 535,957, up 22%, Interlibrary Loans, 34,860 up 18%. Unfortunately, the North Suburban Library System, which has coordinated resource sharing and staff training to its 650+members for half a century, has not received its yearly state funding. The director has announced her resignation and the elimination of most of the staff. Some internal operations of the Lake Forest Library will be affected; at this point, the public will not feel the impact of the cuts.
