

You Should Know

Maintenance Prescriptions

As of January 1, 2015, maintenance medications are **required to go through mail order.** You will be allowed one courtesy refill at the pharmacy in order to give you time to renew prescriptions with your doctor. If there is some sort of medical necessity that prohibits you from using the mail order, you can have the local pharmacy contact your doctor when you fill the prescription. This will only be approved in the case of a true medical necessity, however. Using the mail order prescription program is easy and convenient, and you are encouraged to try it. It also saves you money out of your pocket.

Members who will be impacted should have received enrollment and educational materials in the mail. If you have questions, please call the Serve You RX customer service team (number is on the front of your PBA card – 1-800-759-3203), and they can walk you through the entire process to ensure an easy and comfortable experience.

PBA Cards

An email was sent out to everyone who is on the City's medical insurance last week that they will once again be receiving new ID cards. Hopefully you have received them by now. The Bin# for our prescription drug service changed while the last batch of cards was being printed. They said that this shouldn't cause any problems and we could continue to use the other cards, but there were a few problems. If you previously requested additional cards, those have automatically been provided for you, but will come in a separate envelope.

If you get confused by which card is the most up to date, the new Bin# is 610548. The old number began with 005. Please contact HR if you have any questions.
